<p>It is increasingly realized that the private business sector has played a significant role in stimulating economic development and alleviating poverty in developing countries. Japan International Cooperating Agency (JICA), recognizing the importance of the private business sector, has implemented a variety of industrial development projects with private business partners. JICA considers it necessary to review the experience of implementing such projects, identify their problems and extract lessons. Therefore, this study is expected to examine JICA's industrial development projects carried out with private sector partnership, and to analyze findings from the examination.
